Remarks from the Chair: Retreat Follow Up

Board Member Briefing

In fall, 2014, UCB graduate students in the College of Environmental Design, Adrienne Marshall and Felix Ratcliff, prepared a 13-year post-project analysis of the Dimond Canyon Project. Paul Frank gave a rundown on their report.

Rob Leidy volunteered to sort through hard copy photos of Sausal Creek in Dimond Canyon before the 2001 restoration.

20th Anniversary Brainstorm

Various ideas for FOSC's 20th anniversary celebration in 2016 were discussed. Current board members who were active at the 10th year anniversary were asked to recollect that event. Several board members volunteered to be on a planning committee.

Board Member Briefing

Richard Kauffman gave an update on vegetation management and city coordination. He reminded the board that wildfire is the biggest threat to the watershed, and the current Wildfire Prevention District sunsets in the next few years. He has crafted a letter advocating a comprehensive vegetation management plan for the city.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes from the December 10th, 2014 meeting were unanimously approved.

Financial Report

The Project Timeline and Cash Flow Chart was perused. Our Environmental Education Program received \$6700 funding from *The Clorox Company Foundation*, and \$4000 funding from the *Bill Graham Memorial Foundation*.

Pursuant to the increase in minimum wage in Oakland, our employees' new minimum wage will be \$12.25/hour as of March 2, 2015. They will accrue one hour of sick leave for every 30 hours worked, up to a cap of 40 hours. Kimra will distribute the Paid Sick Leave Policy electronically to the board, which unanimously approved voting on the policy via email.
